Graphene 2014 takes flight in Toulouse

The organizers of <u>Graphene 2014</u> (4th edition - Graphene conference series) are pleased to announce the upcoming International Conference on Graphene to be held in Toulouse (France), home of Airbus. The event will be held from 6 to 9 of May 2014 at the Centre de Congrès Pierre Baudis.

A **Plenary session** with internationally renowned speakers, extensive **thematic workshops** in parallel, an important **industrial exhibition** carried out with the latest Graphene trends and developments for the future and a **brokerage event** will be some of the features of the event.
